

About Our Nurse Aide Training Program

Certified by the Georgia Medical Care Foundation, ESP's Nurse Aide Training Program (NATP) offers qualified individuals the opportunity to become registered as a Certified Nurse Aide (CNA).

The program consists of 14 weeks of classroom training and 3 weeks of clinical training for a total of 17 weeks of training. Classroom training is held at 2100 12th Avenue on Tuesday - Thursday from 5:30- 9:30 p.m., Clinical training is held at a local nursing home from 5:30 - 9:30 p.m. Tuesday - Thursday.

Special emphasis is placed on job readiness and professionalism.

The course is taught by a Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN) and overall coordination is provided by a Registered Nurse (RN).

Requirements for Consideration

of

Admission to the Nurse Aide Training Program

All Clients Must

- ◆ Be a resident of Georgia
- ◆ meet the federal poverty income guidelines
- ◆ Be 18 years of age or older
- ◆ Pass a police background check
- ◆ pass the math, reading and spelling assessment test
- ◆ Have a High School Diploma or GED

Graduation Requirements

In order to successfully complete the course, students must complete a minimum of 160 hours of classroom academic training and 32 hours of clinical training.

Students must maintain an average score of 75% on all exams, complete all work assignments and possess a pleasing, positive attitude toward classmates, the staff of ESP, Inc., as well as the staff and co-workers at the nursing facility in which they will train.

Begining Your Career

During the last week of classroom training, emphasis is placed on job applications and resumes. Students are taught how to:

- Properly complete job applications
- Type a resume
- What to do and what not to do on an interview

After Graduation

Our goals are to improve employability, raise the level of self-sufficiency, and to improve our students' job readiness and life skills to increase the likelihood that our clients will obtain employment and remain employed. In order to obtain these goals the staff of Enrichment Services Program, Inc. Nurse Aide Training Program will work closely with the graduates for ninety (90) days after graduation. During this time ESP conducts follow-up interviews to help with job placement, work ethics and any other area we or our graduates feel will enhance their quality of life.
